## Day 4 | Thursday, June 25<sup>th</sup>

Step back in time and experience the spiritual legacy of the **Adventist Church at Adventist Heritage Village in Battle Creek, Michigan**. This beautifully preserved historical site invites you to walk in the footsteps of early pioneers who helped shape the Seventh-day Adventist movement. Wander through original 19th-century buildings, including the Parkville Church, the home of James and Ellen White, and the first Adventist publishing house—each telling a powerful story of faith, sacrifice, and vision.



## Day 5 | Friday, June 26<sup>th</sup>

Discover the rich spiritual heritage of the **Mennonites at Menno-Hof Museum**, where you'll learn about their history of faith, perseverance, and community. Explore Shippshewana and see how their deep spiritual convictions shaped their way of life, and enjoy the optional lunch to further connect with their culture. In the afternoon, embark on a tour of Andrews University, a center of Adventist education and spiritual growth.



## Day 6 | Saturday, June 27<sup>th</sup>

Begin your Sabbath with an inspiring worship service at the magnificent Pioneer Memorial Church on the campus of Andrews University, soaking in its beautiful music and grand architecture. Following Lunch, take a short, reflective drive to the nearby historic site commemorating "The Old Rugged Cross," where the cherished hymn was first publicly performed. Conclude your day of spiritual and historical enrichment with a visit to the stunning shores of Lake Michigan, where you can stroll along sandy beaches and watch a breathtaking sunset over the vast, freshwater sea for a perfectly peaceful finale.



## Day 7 | Sunday, June 28<sup>th</sup>

We will enjoy a comprehensive city tour of Chicago offers a journey through the heart of its most iconic landmarks, beginning with a vibrant stroll along the Magnificent Mile, where upscale retail and stunning architecture line the bustling avenue.
