Itinerary Main Tour

Gain greater insight into the history, geography and unique features of this historic, biblical places.



Day 1 | Monday, March 30th

Departure

Your journey begins today as you board your international flight to Lisbon. Take this time to relax, preview your itinerary, and imagine the days ahead—sunlit plazas, dramatic cliffs, historic monasteries, and profound moments of reflection.



Day 2 | Tuesday, March 31st

Arrival & Coastal Treasures of Portugal

Arrive in Lisbon and head to Cabo da Roca, the westernmost point of continental Europe. Feel the wind that inspired generations of explorers. Explore Cascais, an elegant coastal town with charming streets and seaside cafés. End the day at Belém Tower, a symbol of Portugal's maritime power.



Day 3 | Wednesday, April 1st

Algarve Beauty & Spanish History

Visit Downtown Lisbon, where history meets modern life, and learn about the Great Lisbon Earthquake of 1755, a catastrophic event that reshaped the city and influenced European thinkers. Travel south to Praia da Marinha, one of Europe's most stunning beaches, framed by golden cliffs and turquoise waters. Then cross into Spain to Palos de la Frontera, where replicas of the Niña, Pinta, and Santa María connect us to Columbus' historic journey to the Americas. Reflect on how these voyages shaped the spread of Christianity and the global context of the Reformation. Overnight in Seville, a city of rich religious and cultural heritage.



Day 4 | Thursday, April 2nd

Seville: Faith and History

Seville offers a deep dive into Reformation-era Spain. Visit the monumental Seville Cathedral, home to Columbus' tomb. Explore the Archivo de Indias, chronicling Spain's global influence. Step into the Monastery of San Isidoro del Campo, a serene place of worship and learning. Learn about the translation of the Bible into Spanish, which challenged Church authority, and explore the Callejón de la Inquisición, hearing stories of the Spanish Inquisition and Auto de Fe, when religious dissenters faced persecution. Conclude at Plaza de España, blending architectural splendor with centuries of history.



Day 5 | Friday, April 3rd

A Taste of Morocco: Chefchaouen

Sail across the Strait of Gibraltar to Morocco and visit Chefchaouen, the "Blue City." Stroll indigo-painted streets, browse vibrant souks, and savor traditional mint tea in a terrace overlooking the Rif Mountains. Chefchaouen offers a peaceful, colorful contrast to Spain, highlighting the diversity of faith and culture during the Reformation era.



Day 6 | Saturday, April 4th

Gibraltar & Sabbath Worship

On the Sabbath, we pause to reflect and enjoy a Sabbath worship experience amid the dramatic scenery of Gibraltar. After worship, explore St. Michael's Cave, meet the famous Barbary macaques, and ride to the summit of the Rock for panoramic views of the Mediterranean and Atlantic. On clear days, Africa shimmers across the Strait. This day combines spiritual reflection, natural beauty, and insights into the strategic maritime routes that influenced Reformation-era Europe.



Day 7 | Sunday, April 5th

Ronda & Granada's Alhambra

Travel inland to Ronda, a cliffside town famous for the dramatic Puente Nuevo. Continue to Granada, home to the Alhambra, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Explore ornate palaces, serene courtyards, and fragrant gardens that reflect Moorish influence. Learn how the Reconquista and Christian-Moorish dynamics shaped religious tensions that set the stage for Reformation-era Spain.



Day 8 | Monday, April 6th

Medieval Toledo

Toledo, the "City of Three Cultures," showcases Spain's layered religious history. Explore Toledo Cathedral, historic synagogues, and artisan workshops producing traditional damascene metalwork. Learn how Toledo became a hub for translating the Bible into Spanish, providing access to scripture and fueling Reformation-era debates on faith and literacy.



Day 9 | Tuesday, April 7th

Madrid at Your Own Pace

Madrid combines grand architecture, lively plazas, and world-class art. Visit the Royal Palace, Puerta del Sol, and Plaza Mayor. The afternoon is free to explore the Prado Museum, stroll Retiro Park, shop along Gran Vía, or enjoy tapas in a sunlit square. Madrid offers both modern vibrancy and connections to centuries of religious and cultural history.



Day 10 | Wednesday, April 8th

Farewell, Spain

After breakfast, transfer to Madrid Airport for your flight home. Depart with vivid memories of cliffs, blue-washed Moroccan streets, Moorish palaces, and the enduring legacy of Columbus, the Reformation, and faith's role in shaping Europe and beyond.
